

MUSIC AND FILMS – B1

I. About this Lesson

Activity title: Music and film

Level: B1

Subject: English as a foreign language

Timing: 50 minutes

Resources: computer with an internet connection, worksheet.

Learning objectives:

- a. Being able to talk about music and film
- **b.** Being able to make comparisons

Materials needed: access to a computer (in order to create their own comic),

printed version of the exercises and comic strips (if the students don't have access to a computer).





II. Lesson scenario

1. Instructions for the teacher

Introduction (5 min)

Start the lesson with a short "Check IN" by telling students:

- Today, we will study music and film vocabulary
- We will talk about your favourite music and films, what you like and dislike.
- Then we will do the exercises from the worksheet
- You will be working individually and in pairs
- Once the exercises are done, we will create a comic strip

Speaking and vocabulary

- a. Print the worksheet and distribute it among students.
- b. Exercise 1: This includes a speaking activity which will encourage students to talk about music. Have an open discussion with your students.
- c. Exercise 2: This includes a list of music-related vocabulary. Students work on this exercise individually. They have to read the definitions and match them with the correct word from the table.

Answers: 1 – F; 2 – J; 3 – H; 4 – I; 5 - G; 6 - C; 7 – D; 8 – B; 9 – E; 10 – A;

- d. Exercise 3: Here students learn about different music genres. They work in pairs and choose the correct music genre that matches the pictures.
- e. Exercise 4: In this exercise, we introduce a series of film genres. Working in pairs or small groups, students match the film with the correct genre. If they are not familiar with the film, they can search for it online or ask for help from other students or the teacher.





f. Exercise 5: Students read the comic strip included. It is an example of the following activity. Then, they stand up. The class is divided in two. The teacher will say an opinion about movies (from the list below) and the students move to the left of the room if they agree and move to the right of the room if they disagree.

Opinions:

- 1. The book is always better than the movie.
- 2. Watching movies at home is fun.
- 3. I can improve my English by watching movies.
- 4. Documentaries are boring!
- 5. Animation is for children. Adults shouldn't watch these movies.
- 6. Superhero movies are boring because they are all the same.
- 7. I like to go to the cinema because it's fun.
- 8. I like TV series better than movies.

Grammar:

- a. The students practise making comparisons. Pre-teach the rules of making comparatives and superlatives in English.
- **b.** Exercise 6: Use the comic strip to review comparatives and superlatives. Students should underline them.
- c. Exercise 7: Students complete the dialogue in the comic strip by using different comparatives or superlatives. Supervise their work and help when needed.
- **d.** Then, give them the original strip and ask them if they had guess the correct meaning.





Finish the lesson with a short "Check out" (5 min)

- a. During the lesson we learn about music, film, and comparisons.
- b. The most important things were: learning how to talk about your favourite films and songs, expressing likes and dislikes, and comparing the different options.
- c. We were able to do identify useful vocabulary and discuss different opinions.
- d. As an assignment you need to..., the deadline is....
- e. We will explore the topic next time when we will learn about (name the following topic)
